Thank you for your interest in joining Camp Kirby's 2025 Outdoor Education Staff! Working with Camp Kirby's Outdoor Education (OE) Program is a unique experience, filled with opportunities for growth, learning, and fun! We are hiring for our Fall OE season. Employment for Fall 2025 will take place over a 7-week period, but work days vary week to week. A week by week calendar of work days can be found on page 4 of this packet. Work days range anywhere from 5 hours to 14 hours on average. Breaks will vary throughout the days, but staff will be free of duties overnight. Pay is \$120/day + room/board for work days.

Camp Kirby's OE program works primarily with local 5th grade students, however schools that attend range from 2nd-12th grade. Our Outdoor Education staff members are responsible for planning and implementing lessons for students based on established curriculum and resources provided during training. Staff will work together to make sure that our OE program runs smoothly. Each staff member will also assist with general maintenance and upkeep of camp, assisting in the kitchen, dishwashing, cleaning, and special projects as needed.

To apply for this position, you can complete the application process through your UltraCamp account (links below). You will need to create an account, complete the application form, answer the supplemental questions, complete a background check form, and send reference requests to the appropriate number of references (one personal and one professional reference for returning staff, and two of each for new staff). Professional references should be former supervisors, teachers, coaches, or other non-family members who are able to speak about your skills as related to working in a camp environment or working with children. General Camp Kirby Information

What is Camp Kirby?



Camp Kirby is a traditional youth camp that has been operating for over 100 years, and is owned by Camp Fire Samish. Over 1,000 children attend Outdoor School at Camp Kirby each year. We're also accredited by the American Camp Association, meeting hundreds of standards for program quality, health, safety, facilities, and administration.

Where is Camp Kirby?

Camp Kirby is located on Samish Island in Bow, Washington. It is 1-1/2 hours northwest of Seattle, and 45 minutes southwest of Bellingham, WA. Samish Island is a drive-on island which is connected to the mainland.

What are Camp Kirby's Facilities?

Kirby's facilities are rustic and complement the natural setting of 47 acres that includes 1-1/2 miles of waterfront and 20+ acres of forest. Staff will be housed together in our Halcyon staff lounge. The building is heated and contains shared bathrooms that are only for staff use. Meals are served family-style in a lodge dining room, but staff housing does include a kitchen as well. Kirby's emphasis is strongly placed on outdoor activities and focused on the natural environment. **Camp Kirby is a drug, alcohol, and tobacco free atmosphere and site.**

General Employment Information

Qualifications for all staff members:

The Kirby experience is unique and rewarding but requires hard work to reap the rewards. All staff members must have a willingness to uphold Camp Kirby's policies, standards, and program quality. Employment is subject to criminal history checks, reference and background checks, and verification of eligibility to work in the U.S.A. All employees must be at least 18 years old and high school graduates. One year of college or equivalent life experience is preferred.

Required Certifications:

- ❑ **Pediatric & Adult CPR, AED, and First Aid are required for all positions.** The class must be at least 50% in-person, and from a nationally recognized provider. A list of these providers can be found [here](#).

Salary and Benefits:

Camp Kirby seasonal staff are paid a \$120 daily salary for the OE season. Work weeks range from three to six days. Room and board at Camp Kirby is included on work days. We are not able to offer room and board every weekend. If this presents a hardship for you, please reach out to Kathryn at kathryn@campfiresamish.org so that we can discuss further. There are many unique benefits that come with working at Camp. Food and lodging is provided for all positions on work days, in addition to workers' compensation insurance, most weekends off, and two paid sick days. Other perks include access to laundry facilities, a staff lounge, free coffee/tea/cocoa bar, and a beautiful setting. Staff members also have access to free or low-cost training and professional development opportunities.

Internships and College Credit:

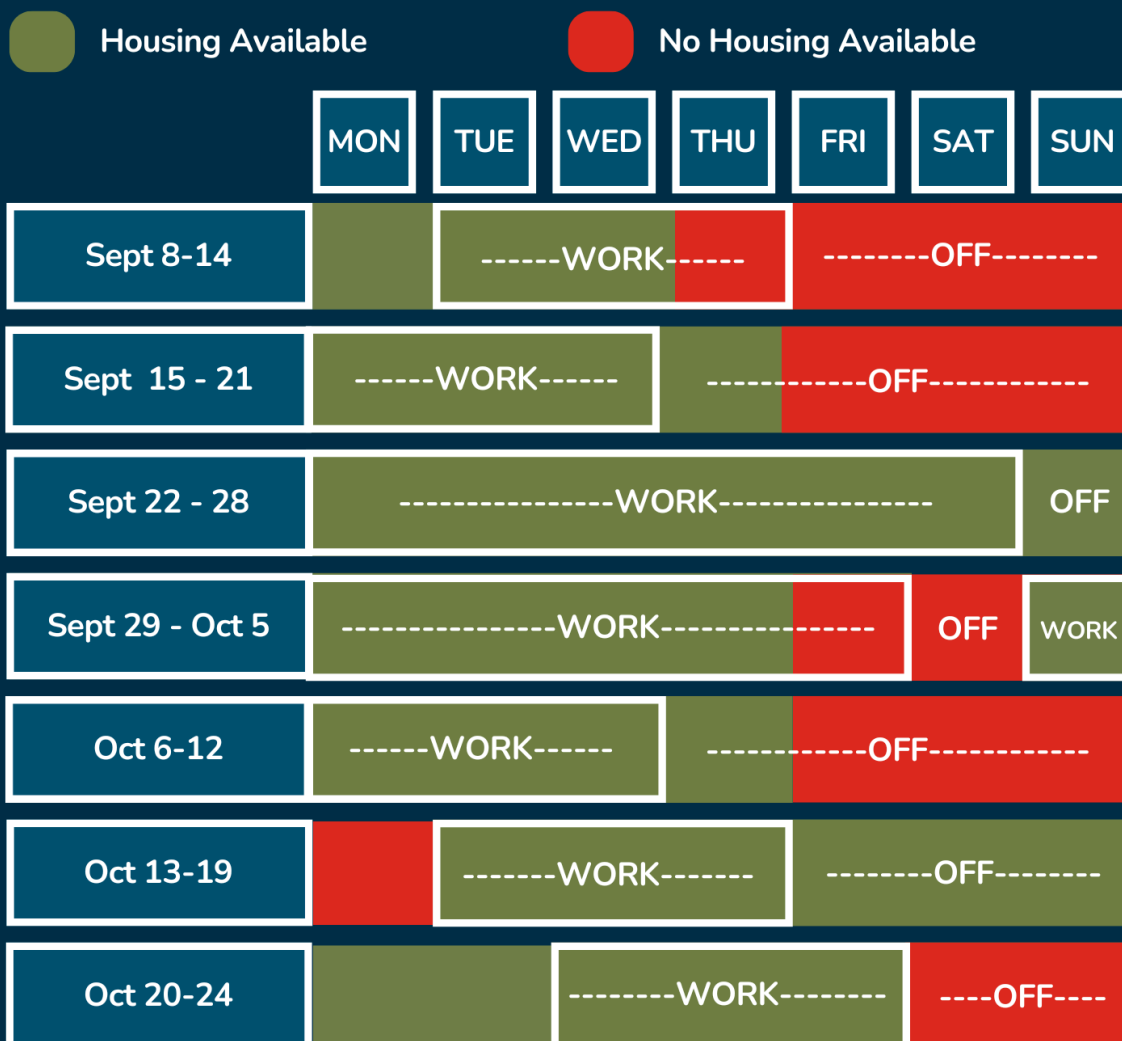
